H.E. AMBASSADOR LI JIE, ENVOY OF THE PEOPLES REPUBLIC OF CHINA (PRC) TO THE REPUBLIC OF ZAMBIA DELIVERS INAUGURAL KENNETH D. KAUNDA DISTINGUISHED PUBLIC SERVICE LECTURE; MULUNGUSHI UNIVERSITY, 28 NOVEMBER, 2019

The Ambassador of the Peoples Republic of China (PRC) to the Republic of Zambia, His Excellency Li Jie delivered the Inaugural Kenneth D. Kaunda Distinguished Public Service Lecture on Thursday, 28 November, 2019 in the New Lecture Theater (NELT).
